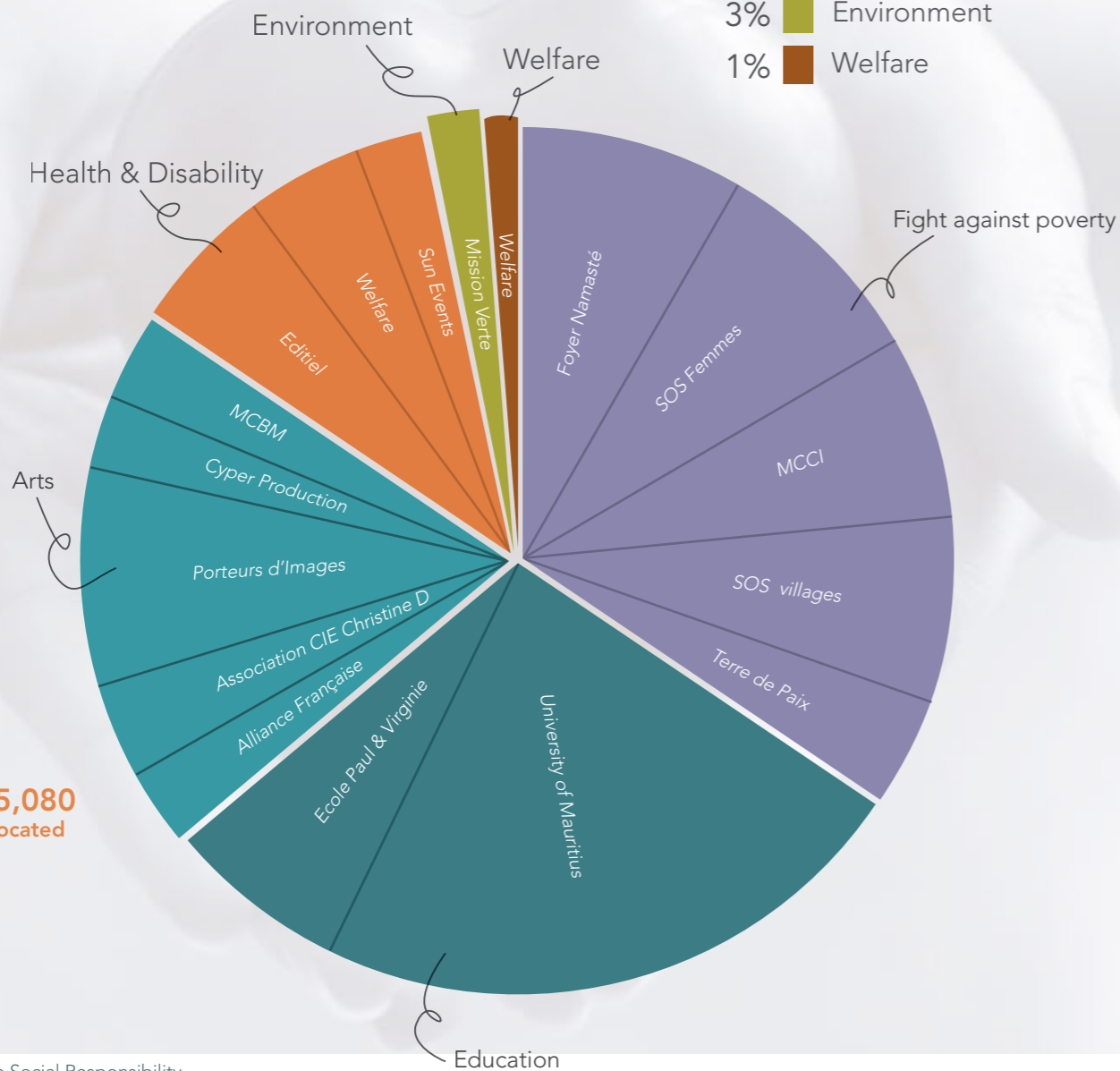

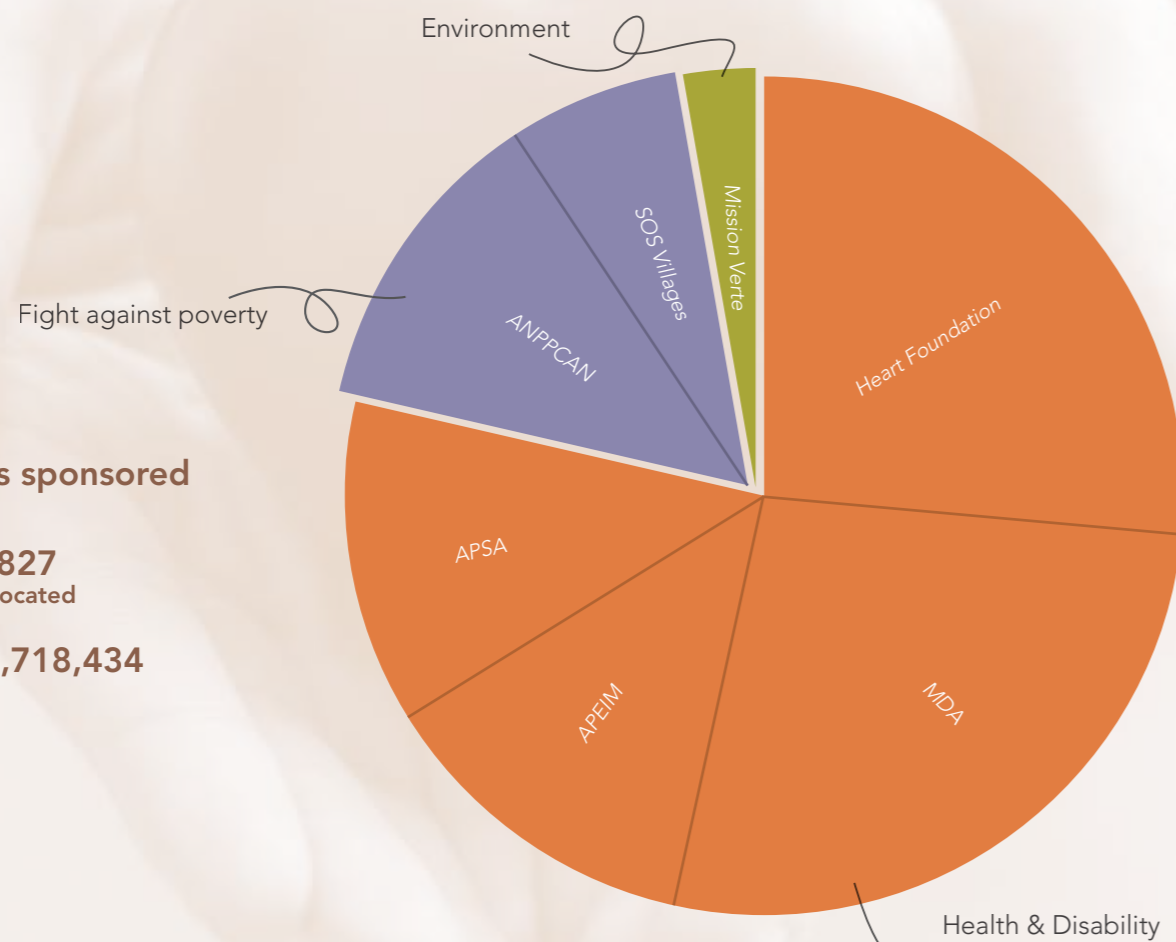
### Distribution of financing by activity sector (2009-2010)

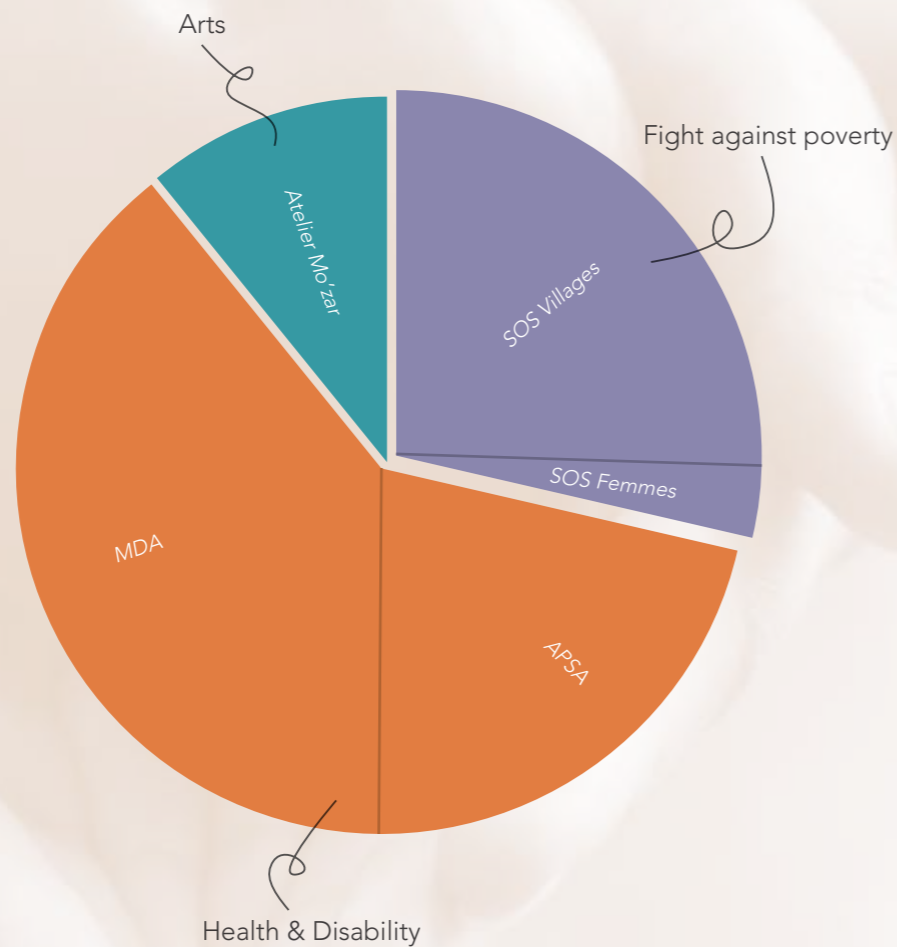

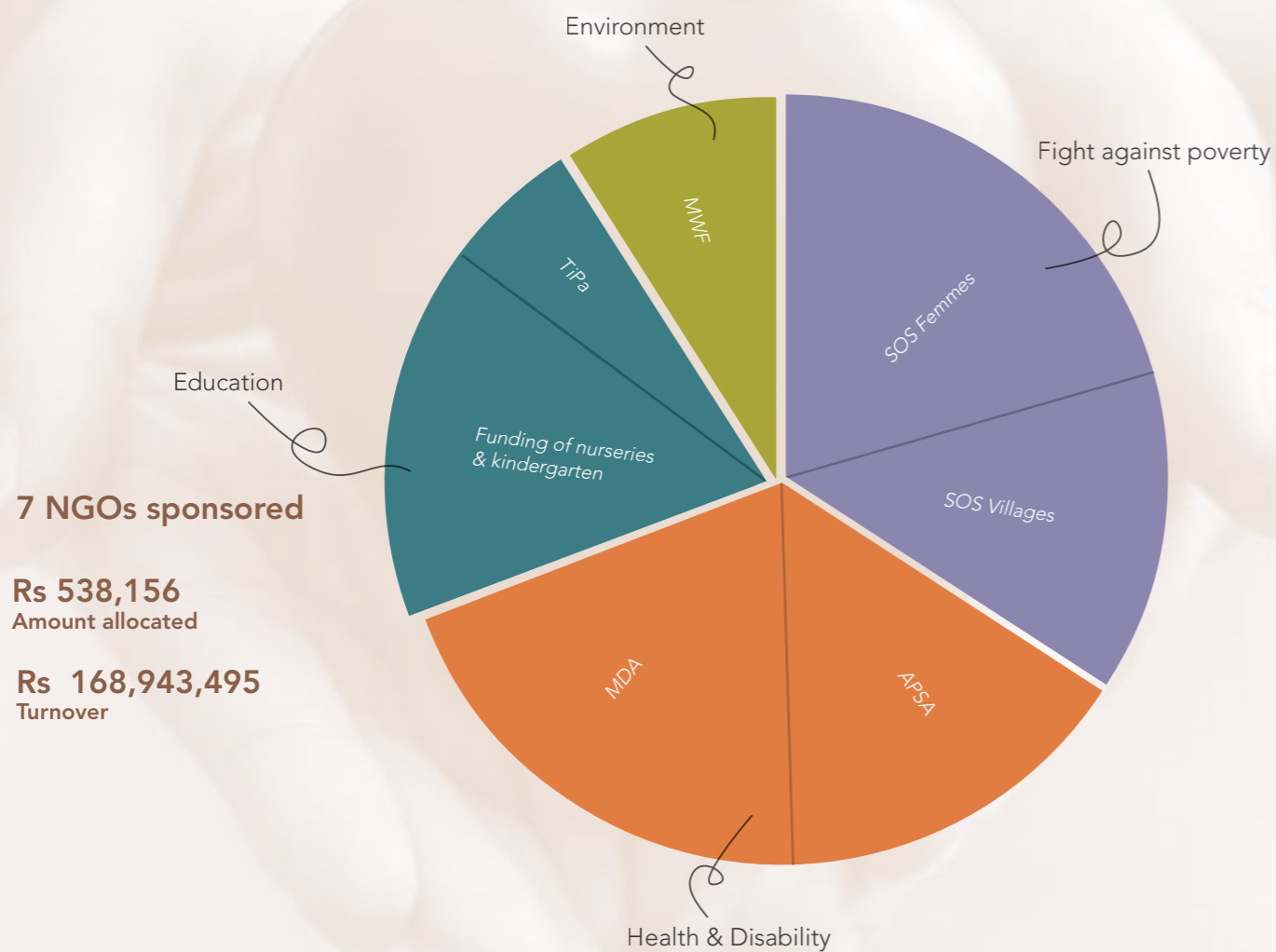

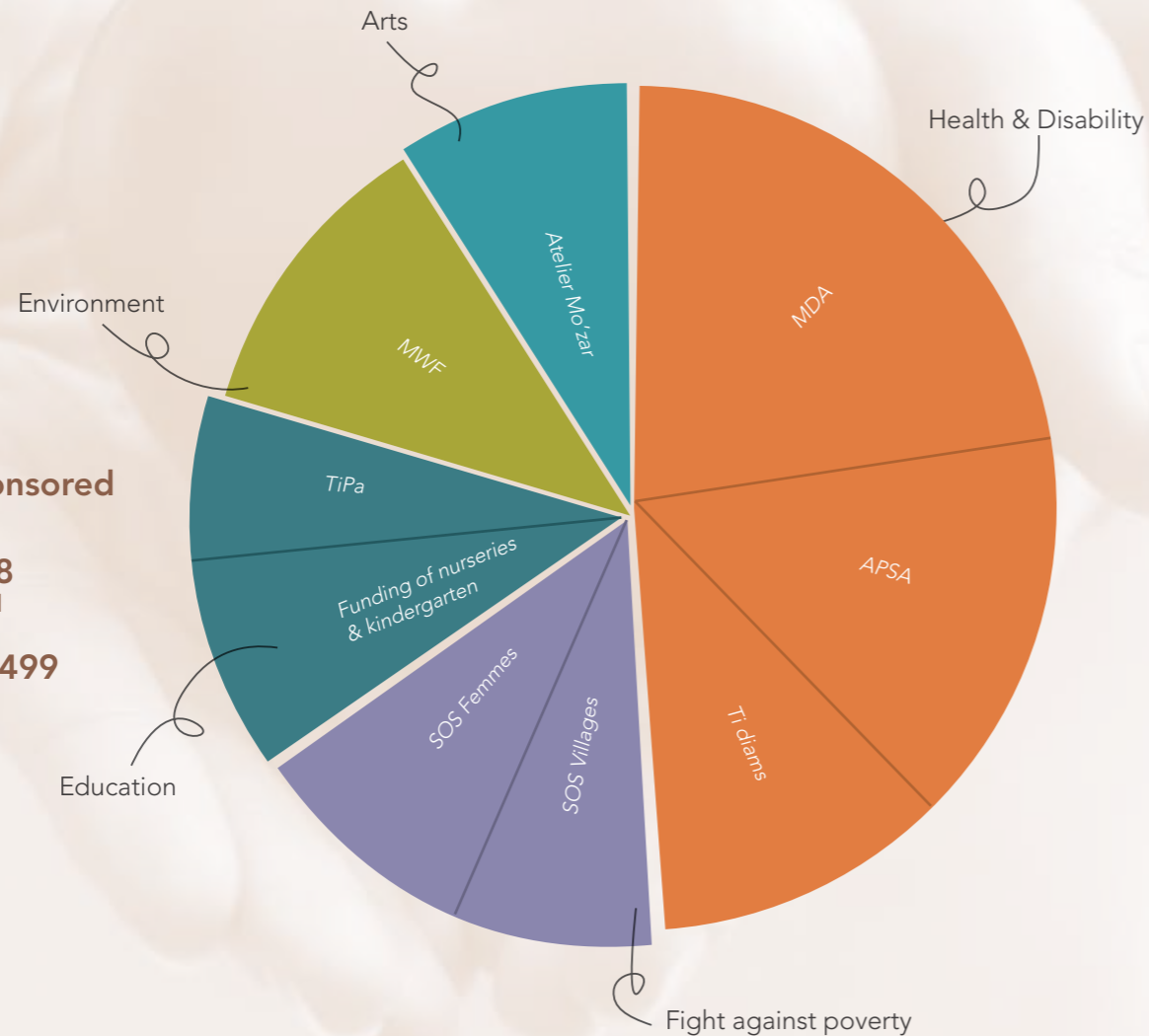
